4. TWO letters of reference from the referees named in the application - ONE from a teacher at current or most recent school and ONE from a non-teacher familiar with your community service and involvement . **\*NB References must email their recommendations (via the form provided) directly to [cbwwaterlooregion@gmail.com](mailto:cbwwaterlooregion@gmail.com)**
5. A 300 word (minimum) essay outlining your academic achievement, school and community contributions, and your personal efforts to finance your education.
6. TWO professional 5' X 7' photographs for publicity purposes in JPEG original file copy . *We cannot accept scanned photographs.*

### AWARDS

The Chloe Callender Awards ( 3-5) \$1500 scholarships - honour a lifetime of contribution and achievement. Chloe Callender is the founding President of the Waterloo Chapter of the Congress of Black Women, starting the chapter in 1988. She also served the Ontario Regional President of the CBW for two years. An educator, community leader and Anti-racism trainer, Ms. Callender has promoted positive cross-cultural and ethnocultural relations through networks and social justice action. She is the Co-Founder of the K-W Caribbean- Canadian Cultural Association (now CCAWR) and the recipient of many prestigious national, provincial, and regional awards, and has served on various boards in Waterloo Region. Ms Callender continues to be a part of the Waterloo Chapter of the Congress of Black Women.

The Esselyne Bell Education Scholarship, \$1500 - honours Mrs. Bell's contribution to the CBW Waterloo Region Scholarship Program. She is one of the founding members. For nearly 30 years, she has been instrumental in organizing and preparing meals for Black History Month celebrations, first at the former Maranatha Church and more recently at Mount Zion Lutheran church in Waterloo. Her influence has helped initiate other ministries at Mount Zion for which we are grateful. Mrs. Bell has received many awards for community service, including the CCAWR Person of Distinction in 2015; the City of Kitchener's Senior of the Year in 2018' and for Outstanding Service to the Wider Community in the Eastern Synod of the Evangelical Church in Canada in 2022.

The Mount Zion Education Scholarship, \$1500 - offers financial assistance to individuals through funds raised at the annual Black History Month Celebration and the Mount Zion Caribbean Christmas Party. These celebrations became part of the ministry of Mount Zion when several members of the former Marantha Congregation joined the church. Since then, Mount Zion has contributed to the CBWC - Waterloo Region Scholarship Program and the CCAWR. We are thrilled to contribute to the future of youth in the Region through this scholarship.

Each year the Congress of Black Women of Canada (CBWC) Waterloo Chapter provides the opportunity for Black students from Waterloo Region to receive support to attend post-secondary institutions in Canada.
